## <u>Ministry of Tourism and TT Carnival Museum Launch Youth Initiative - 'Foundation Meets the Future'</u>

The first session featured cultural icon and Calypsonian Dr. David Michael Rudder and renowned local musician, Mr. Muhammad Muwakil of Freetown Collective, as they shared their cultural and industry insights with 30 students from Belmont Secondary School and St. Margaret's Boys Anglican School.
